



Work primarily centered on repair of the roof and the kitchen, but also included removal of mud from the old heating/air ducts under the house and installation of a new heat & air system relocated to the attic. New appliances and cabinets were purchased for the kitchen.



While the Home Builder volunteers worked on the physical facilities, associate member Amy Shamblin of Mill Creek Insurance, worked to collect diapers, wipes, formula and clothes and toys for the couple's 4 month old baby.

An employee from Corlis Design, employees at Carelink and several friends and family of Shamblin contributed to the baby shower project. Over \$400 was spent to purchase the baby items, including a piggy bank with change to start her savings program.

"Before the crew left, the baby was playing in the floor with one of the toys purchased," said Shamblin. "They are just a young couple that have been struck with hard times and it was very gratifying to be able to help them out," she said.
