

1979 - February 3 - a special meeting was called to consider an administrative crisis.

1979 - May 21 - David Yoder, association legislative chairman, told the US House Ways & Means Committee that HR 3712 (The Ullman Bill) would "inevitably create a catastrophe in housing in WV."

1979 - May 22 - Moving day to the new WV Housing Center. Home of the HBA of WV, HBA of Greater Charleston, Builders Emergency Housing Corp, Home Owners Warranty Corp & WV Home Show.

1979 - July 24 - West Virginia led a 38 state HBA conference in Washington concerning loss of tax exempt mortgage bond authority.



1979 - Lou Cavallero is a candidate for Vice President/Secretary of NAHB. Group travels to Las Vegas for the campaign

1980 - Multiple trips to Washington to seek help on tax exempt bonds

1980 - March 14 - Emergency meeting of builders in Charleston concerning the declining industry

1980 - March 18 - WVHDF approves \$40 million bond issue "as a direct response to the needs expressed by home builders."

1980 - Aug. 21 - A flash flood in the Beckley office of Bedford Morris destroys the WV Builder library.

1981 - January 15 - Association proposes to the governor that \$100 million of state funds to be made available for mortgages

1981 - February 2 - News conference at the Housing Center regarding the mortgage proposal

1981 - March 5 - Joined with other groups in a crisis meeting at the Civic Center

1981 - March 19 - meeting with Gov. Rockefeller about mortgage finance

1981 - Nov. 9 - Legislative task force on housing concerning mortgage loan needs

1982 - Housing task force approves resolution for establishment of mortgage loan pool as proposed by the association in 1980.

1982 - March 13 - Legislature establishes mortgage finance pool
